# The Vision

## **Our Mission-**

We are a co-op grounded in the Christian worldview, seeking to glorify God in all things. Families learn together in a holistic, age-integrated environment with break-out sessions to meet the specific needs of various age groups. This type of structure facilitates family unity and ignites excitement in students for their studies. When children develop a passion for learning, they become initiators in discussing important topics, expressing themselves through writing, creatively pursuing goals, directing projects, and even starting businesses.

## **Core Subjects and Curriculum-**

We are a project and literature-based co-op requiring parents to participate in the educational process as teachers and facilitators. Parent instructors will find support by serving within their giftings and areas of expertise. Operating core classes from standard curricula unifies our group and strengthens each family's quest to cover required subjects adequately.

## **Extra Classes-**

We anticipate additional educational experiences from our core class interaction. These activities will be scheduled as needed outside of the core class day. They may include field trips, extra-curricular classes, and electives- all of which will build life skills and create ever-growing opportunities for our young people.

## **Socialization-**

Community is the fruit of a shared journey. As families share the rich learning experience and grow together, we are confident that meaningful, lasting friendships will result for both students and parents.

# The Format

The Rooted Family Homeschool Co-op will begin the first week of September 2025 and end the week before Memorial Day in May 2026. Our co-op meets on Fridays.

This co-op is not a drop-off program but one where we all come together to create a learning environment where our children can thrive. Therefore, all families will take turns teaching and supporting whoever is teaching while keeping everyone with their most comfortable age group and subject. When you pre-register, please designate which subjects and ages you would like to teach or help organize.

Families are welcome to use whatever curriculum they choose at home, whether it follows along with our lessons or not. Our weekly meeting day will provide stand-alone lessons with activities for children to engage with the material. Projects will be worked on during class.

Throughout the year, there are extra opportunities for activities and field trips. All are welcome to participate as much or as little as they choose in the extra activities, which include field trips, life skills opportunities, organized games and gym, and other additional classes.

Our year will culminate in May with a ceremony showcasing our students' work and achievements. Each family will be provided a table to display work and projects done through the co-op and at home. Friends, family members, and prospective families are welcome to attend.

## **9:30 a.m. – Morning Gathering**

Students arrive, and the day opens with prayer. We will then move through a devotional as a large group

## **10:00 a.m. – Music**

In music, the focus is on actively working all the muscles that make strong musicians: beat and rhythm, ear training, and creative instruction. Using mainly their voices and bodies as instruments, students will experience choral pieces, improv, and write their own songs. This middle school group will join the high school group for music. school group for this class.

## **10:50 a.m. – Science**

Our middle school-aged kids will study chemistry this year with hands-on experiment-based lessons.

## **11:55 a.m. – Lunch**

Lunch will be enjoyed with the high school-aged group.

## **12:30 p.m. – Gym**

They will participate in physical education activities with the high school-aged group.

## **12:35 p.m. – Investigation Studio**

Our middle school group will also be engaging in a project-based class similar to the high school-aged class and will join the older kids in the execution of their projects, but they will also spend time learning more of the mechanics of writing, early entrepreneurial concepts, and history/economics principles.

# The Schedule- Ages 14-18

## **9:30 a.m. – Morning Gathering**

Students arrive, and the day opens with prayer. We will then move through a devotional as a large group

## **10:00 a.m. – Science**

Our science class will be learning about Chemistry this year through hands-on lessons and experiments.

## **10:50 a.m. – Music**

In music, the focus is on actively working all the muscles that make strong musicians: beat and rhythm, ear training, and creative instruction. Using mainly their voices and bodies as instruments, students will experience choral pieces, improv, and write their own songs. This middle school group will join the high school group for music. school group for this class.

## **11:55 a.m. – Lunch**

Lunch will be enjoyed with the high school-aged group.

## **12:30 p.m. – Gym**

Our middle and high school groups will be combined for physical education activities.

## **12:35 p.m. – Investigation Studio**

This class will give the high school students entrepreneurial, community service, and history projects, encouraging project and interest-based learning as well as helping kids learn to collaborate with peers towards a common goal.

# Statement of Faith

# The Expectations

## Family Participation

Everyone is gifted differently and serves in some way. If the thought of teaching makes you break out in a sweat, it's ok. Other support, hospitality, administration, and coordination positions need to be filled. This group is intended to be life-giving and should relieve some of the pressure of homeschooling.

\*\* We currently need teachers for all three science classes and both gym classes. If you are willing to help out in this way, please let us know. The science classes are already laid out with topics and lessons by week, if that is something that would help you, but you are more than welcome to make your own. \*\*

## Field Trips and Extra Classes

From time to time, field trips and extra classes are available. Depending on the field trip, activity, or class instructor, this day will sometimes have additional costs. The yearly registration fee does not include the cost of extra activities. Participation is entirely voluntary with each event offered.

## **Fundraising**

To keep our costs low, we need to do a couple of fundraisers throughout the year. There will be a fundraiser in the fall, which is yet to be determined, and a Mother's Day Bouquet fundraiser in the Spring. We encourage families to sell to family, church family, friends, and acquaintances.

## **Meeting Day**

Our goal is to provide a fun and functional school day that can be sufficient for certain subject requirements with minimal, if any, effort at home. We also need the children to stay safe during meeting hours. So here are some basic expectations that need to be followed to keep our program running smoothly:

1. Children must remain in the building during meeting day.
2. Running is not allowed within the building except for designated areas and lessons.
3. Outside doors must remain closed.
4. Haven Gray's building rules must be respected, as laid out in the Student Conduct Agreement (section below).
5. This is not a drop-off program, so if you cannot attend that day, you must arrange for another person to be responsible for your child(ren).
6. Adults are encouraged to participate in the learning times with the kids so that good student behaviors are modeled.
7. Parents are responsible for disciplining their children, although a teacher may speak to a child if the parent is not present in the classroom.
8. We will eat lunch together, but families must bring their own lunch. There is limited refrigeration space and a kitchenette available.
9. You are expected to clean up after yourselves and participate in group cleaning time.

## End-of-year program

We plan to have an open house sometime in May. This event will be for families, grandparents, extended family, and friends to view schoolwork, projects, and musical performances. Be thinking about what you want to display as your child(ren) complete projects. Some families use cardboard displays with tablecloths, and some families just lay items out on the table. You can do as little or as much as you choose.

## Discipline and Conflict Resolution

Inevitably, there will be discipline and conflict resolution needs. In the classroom, a teacher may verbally correct a child once, kindly, before calling in the parent. No corporal punishment may be used. Disruptive behavior will make the experience unpleasant for the teacher and other students and inhibit learning. If the disruptive behavior is not corrected after it has been brought to the parent, it will be brought to the leadership team and addressed.

We expect adults to handle conflicts in a proactive Biblical way, modeled after Jesus' words in Matthew 18:15-17- first privately between the people involved in the conflict and then brought to leadership for mediation if a resolution cannot be reached privately. Should an ongoing issue not be resolved and the Statement of Faith not be respected, leadership may ask a family to leave the group without a refund of registration fees.

# Conduct Agreement

Students (and anyone associated with Rooted Family Homeschool Co-op) will respect the building.

1. No one (students, parents, siblings, etc.) is allowed to wander the building. Anyone associated with Rooted Family Homeschool Co-op may only use the designated restroom and classrooms. In case of an emergency, parents may escort their children to an alternative restroom on a different floor. (Other organizations are conducting business in other areas of the building. We want to be polite, quiet, and respectful of everyone's space.)
2. All food and drinks, including snacks, must be left in the classroom with the kitchenette. Only water is allowed in the other classrooms. Please clean up any mess you make, including spills, crumbs, wrappers, etc. If you need cleaning supplies, please ask Bridgette Heap.
3. We will leave the building better than we found it. Because there is no cleaning staff, we are responsible for our mess. Parents, please take the initiative to check the space being used by your children and to keep it clean. Please be considerate of the building and others who need to use it after us.
4. When coming and going to the building, please be respectful of the neighbors' properties. Please do not go on their properties.
5. When parking, please use the parking lot behind Community Bank. Please leave the limited parking spaces in front of the building for families with infants.

Students (and anyone associated with Rooted Family Homeschool Co-op) will be respectful to others.

1. Students must follow classroom etiquette. The leadership team may dismiss families from the co-op without a refund.
2. Students should be willing to participate in all activities, asking questions and sharing their opinions where appropriate.
3. There will be no running, yelling, or roughhousing in the building. We will respect the building and each other and maintain a fun but respectful learning atmosphere.
